



Exploring a Latrobe Valley aquaculture industry

Opal Australian Paper, in partnership with Mainstream Aquaculture and the Victorian Government is embarking on an Aquaculture feasibility study into the production of barramundi in the Latrobe Valley.







This \$1.24 million feasibility study will investigate the technical, commercial, social and environmental aspects of a leading edge Recirculating Aquaculture System (RAS) facility. As part of the study, Mainstream Aquaculture and Opal Australian Paper will conduct due diligence on the design and engineering for

a RAS facility; a highly efficient, self-contained, scalable system that would operate with accredited bio-security protocols. If the project proceeds, it could support up to 500 jobs during the construction phase and approximately 190 direct and indirect jobs ongoing. The study is expected to be completed by mid-2020.

Why Opal Australian Paper?

Currently around 70% of the seafood consumed in Australia is imported. This aquaculture facility would be undertaken in partnership with Mainstream Aquaculture, a global leader in barramundi production.

The feasibility study is investigating an investment of up to \$150 million in an enclosed Recirculating Aquaculture

System (RAS) facility which could produce up to 10,000 tonnes of barramundi annually positioning the Latrobe Valley as a centre for barramundi farming in Australia.
